

 - Statistics Canada Historic Labour Force Survey (March 2011)


Population Projections 2010 to 2036


SCOR Region Population by Age Group 2011 Estimates





SCOR Region – Business Location Quotients 2011



Change in the Number of Businesses 2009 to 2011




Change in the Number of Businesses by Sector June 2009 to June 2011


SCOR Region Agricultural Businesses Location Quotients 2011

Location Quotients identify how local industries compare to the provincial average, and it is a measurement of the concentration of businesses in a particular sector.




Regional Economic Context

The London Economic Region contains three of the five SCOR Region Counties (See Map). It is a good reference area for SCOR and data is available on current economic trends for the larger regional economy.




Change in Employment 2005 - 2010
